Subject: Pilot project on "Pit & Fissure Sealant application" under National Oral Health Program(NOHP)

Madam/Sir,

I am directed to say that, National Oral Health Program (NOHP) is a new initiative by Government of India in the 12th Plan from FY2014-15 to strengthen the Oral Health care delivery in the country. Under the central component of NOHP, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has taken an initiative for applying "Pit & Fissure Sealant" in permanent molars as a pilot project to assess the feasibility, so that it can be adapted as a caries preventive modality in the existing public health facilities in future.

In India about 50-60% of the children of school going age are affected by Dental caries which leads to expensive dental treatment, pain and sometimes loss of tooth in advanced stages. Therefore, this has got significant morbidity and adds burden towards health care mainly among the people from low socio economic strata. About 90% of tooth decay(dental caries) occurs in the pit and fissures of permanent posterior Teeth. Permanent molars are at highest risk of developing cavity (Dental Caries) within 2-2.5 years of eruption into oral environment. Dental Sealants are composite resin materials (Something like opaque plastic) that can be applied to the pit and fissures (Developmental Grooves) on the occlusal (Chewing) surface of tooth. It is a completely noninvasive, safe, reliable & proven procedure globally to prevent initiation of dental cavities and has been adapted by many developed and developing nations as a part of school/community health program. It prevents initiation and arrest progression of tooth decay by providing a physical barrier against micro organisms and food particles that gets collected on the chewing surface.

The following Government Dental Colleges under the state administration have been selected to carry out this task:

- i. Maulana Azad Institute of Dental Sciences, New Delhi
- ii. Faculty of Dentistry, KGMU, Lucknow.
- iii. SCB Dental College, Guntak
- iv. Government Dental College, Ahmadabad
- v. Government Dental College, Bangalore
- vi. Government Dental College, Chennai
- vii. Government Dental College, Hyderabad
- viii. Regional Dental College, Guwahati

Apart from the above Government Dental Colleges, Dental Departments of two autonomous institutions under MoHFW have also been selected for the above said work:

- i. Oral Health Sciences center, PGIMER, Chandigarh
- ii. Department of Dentistry, RIMS, Imphal

The selected institutions are requested to utilise the existing interns, Post Graduate students in the Dept. of Public Health Dentistry for this purpose. In case of inadequate staff in the aforesaid department, alternative arrangements may be made by involving other specialities. MoHFW has kept a target of sealing 5000 molars/selected institution in this pilot project for which 100% financial support will be provided not exceeding Rs 7.2lakh /Institution. Grants will be released in two installments, 70% in the beginning after the MoU is signed & 30% after satisfactory progress of the work with interim report after 6 months of release of 1st installment. The implementing authority has to submit the Statement of Expenditure (SOE), Audited Utilization Certificate (UC) etc as per provisions under GFR 2005

An MoU & Bank mandate form has been enclosed herewith for signature by your good self, Principal of the selected Dental College or an authorized officer on behalf of Principal, and may be sent back to this ministry along with duly filled bank mandate form of the grantee institution to facilitate the implementation of the project. A one day workshop will be organized in Delhi to discuss and finalise the details regarding implementation of the project which will be communicated soon.


Sir/Madam,

TA / DA rules

1. TA / DA would be reimbursed for only 3 persons per Institute. In case more than 3 persons is deputed for the meeting, the TA and per-diem expenses would be borne by concerned Institute / participant himself / herself.
2. TA will be reimbursed as per actual only if the following rules are complied with
 - a. Travel mode must comply with the entitlement of the travelling officer.
 - b. Air travel is to be made with shortest & direct route, cheapest, economy class return fare ticket of Air India only.
 - c. The air ticket is to be purchased directly through Air India website / booking counter / office. Ticket can also be purchased through authorized travel agents namely, M/s Balmer Lawrie and Company, M/s Ashok Travels and Tours and IRCTC. Tickets purchased through any other travel agents will not be reimbursed.
 - d. In case of non-availability of Air - India flight, please refer to guidelines for relaxation in Annexure A.
 - e. Return Train ticket / Return Air India flight ticket with boarding pass should be submitted in original.
 - f. Actual fare will be paid for travel by public bus. Original bus ticket should be submitted.
 - g. For travel made through car / taxi / auto rickshaw, the reimbursement will be as per Government of India rules. Pre-paid taxis / autos may be used and receipts submitted for reimbursement.
3. Each participant is entitled to Dearness Allowance as per Government of India rules in Annexure C. Reimbursement will be done on production of receipts.
4. Each participant is requested to furnish original Mandate Form (in Annexure D) attested by the Bank at the Training Workshop for the reimbursement.

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)

Between

**Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW),
Government of India**

&

1. Preamble

1.1 Whereas Dental Caries is of significant public health importance in India and 50-60% of the younger population are affected by it, leading to morbidity, loss of school hours & significant economic burden on the country directly or indirectly.

1.2 Whereas majority of the caries begins on the developmental irregularities of the teeth present in the occlusal surface (Chewing Surface) of the molars.

1.3 Whereas Pit & Fissure sealant has been a proven, reliable, non invasive procedure that can be carried out on the molars to prevent dental caries beginning in the occlusal surface.

In an attempt to protect the molars from occlusal caries, this pilot project is initiated by MoHFW in collaboration with Government Dental colleges/Autonomous bodies. Now therefore, the signatories to this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) have agreed as set out herein below:

2. Signatories:

2.1 The MoU is being signed between Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India represented by Director/Deputy Secretary looking after the National Oral Health Program, NOHP (hereafter referred to as MoHFW-1st Party),

2.2 The State Government [For Govt. Dental Institutions under the ambit of State Administration] represented by Principal Secretary Health & FW (Here after referred to as - 2nd Party)

And

2.3 Director/Principal /Head of the department of the implementing institution (hereafter referred to as Coordinator of the project-3rd party) on School based sealant program, as per the terms and conditions given below:-

3. Duration of the MoU

3.1 This MoU will be operative with effect from date of agreement and will remain in force till one year or till its renewal through mutual agreement.

4. Deliverables:

4.1 To complete application of Pit & Fissure sealants in 5000 molars successfully among the 6-14 years age group children within the time period specified above.

5. Financing:

5.1 The MoHFW will provide financial support (Rs 7.2 Lakh Max.) to the institution involved for the proposed activity.

5.2 Funding will be for both recurring and non-recurring activities as per following general conditions:

5.2.1 It is presumed that the execution of the work does not create any employer/employee relationship. In this respect, the contractual partner shall be solely responsible for the manner in which the work is carried out. Thus, MoHFW will not be responsible for any loss, accident, damages or injury suffered by any person whatsoever arising in or out of the execution of this work, including travel.

5.2.2 All rights in the work, including ownership of the original work and copyright thereof, shall be vested in MoHFW, which reserves the right (a) to revise the work, (b) to use the work in a different way from that originally envisaged, or (c) to publish or use the work.

5.2.3 If the option, on the face of this agreement, for payment of a fixed sum applies, that sum is payable in the manner provided, subject to proper performance of the work. If the option for payment of a maximum amount applies, the funds shall be used exclusively for the work specified in this agreement and any unspent balance shall be refunded to MoHFW. In this latter case, any financial statement required shall reflect expenditures according to the relevant main categories of expenditure.

5.2.4. If the work is not satisfactorily completed (and, where applicable, delivered) by the date fixed in this agreement and/or if any financial statement required is not satisfactorily submitted to MoHFW in accordance with general condition 5 below, MoHFW may specify an additional period within which this agreement must be satisfactorily performed. Normally, such additional period should be of at least one month duration, unless it is clear from the agreement that it was particularly important that the performance be completed on the date specified, in which case MoHFW may specify a shorter period or refuse to grant any additional period at all. In the event that the work is not satisfactorily completed and delivered on the date fixed and/or if any financial statement required is not satisfactorily submitted to MoHFW in accordance with general condition 5 below, or any additional period granted, MoHFW may rescind this agreement (in addition to the other remedies), subject to an equitable arrangement being made in case of delay caused by force majeure.

5.2.5. The contractual partner shall complete and deliver the work to MoHFW (including any technical report that may be required) by the date fixed in this agreement or any additional period that may be granted by MoHFW under general condition 4 above. Any financial statement required shall be submitted within thirty days thereafter at the latest date. If the payment schedule on the face of this agreement provides for a

Final payment upon completion of the work, this final payment shall be made only after satisfactory receipt of all deliverables called for under this agreement, including any technical report and financial statement

5.2.6. Grants will be released in two installments: 70% in the beginning after the MoU is signed & 30% after satisfactory progress of the work with interim report after 6 months of release of 1st installment. The implementing authority has to submit the Statement of Expenditure (SOE), Audited Utilization Certificate (AUC) etc as per provisions under G.O.R 2005.

6. Penalty Clause:





In case of violation of any of the provisions of this Agreement /MoU by the Grantee Institution the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare will be at liberty to terminate the contract and the concerned institution/State Government will have to refund the entire grant money along with interest.

7. Disputes & Resolution

Any dispute relating to the interpretation or application of this agreement shall, unless amicably settled, be subject to conciliation. In the event of failure of the latter, the dispute shall be referred to Secretary (Health & Family Welfare), Government of India for resolution and his/her decision will be final in the matter. It shall be binding on the state Government & Grantee institution.


